This will empower healthcare service providers with the capabilities to facilitate web-to-phone calls between themselves and patients in need of care.

With the current COVID-19 climate, co-founder and CEO of Novocall, Junjie and his team wanted to see how best they could put their technology to practical use. They decided to extend their software, at no charge, to healthcare providers. This helps patients intending to seek care, to reach providers with ease; clarify waiting times, schedules, and availability of supplies beforehand, through a quickly connected call.

SUTD Startup Kronikare rises to COVID-19 challenge

Teamed with government health tech agency, IHiS, Kronikare co-developed iThermo, which uses artificial intelligence (AI) to perform temperature screenings. While forehead thermometers can measure up to two to three people a minute, the iThermo is able to ramp that number up to 10 people a minute.

It scans people's temperature as they walk by and alerts staff to those with higher temperatures. Visitors wouldn't have to stop to be measured. It is also safer for frontline staff as they are less likely to come in contact with people with undetected infections, and requires less people to operate.

Beep: Making dumb machines smart

Founded in 2018 by a team of freshmore students, Beep originally started off by designing their own EZ-Link card payment solution for use in our canteen.

With close guidance and mentorship from SUTD EC, coupled with strong support from the ongoing DBS-SUTD collaboration — Beep pivoted into developing unattended payment solutions for beverage companies (F&N, Pokka & Yeo's) in collaboration with NETS & DBS.

As e-payments continue to proliferate across ASEAN, Beep expanded regionally as well, and is now live in 20 different e-wallets regionally — including Grab (SG, Malaysia, Philippines, and Vietnam), Gojek, TouchNGo & DBS PayLah.

Beep is now actively working on expanding its solutions into more novel unattended verticals — (laundromats, smart Lockers, photocopier and contact tracing for access control).

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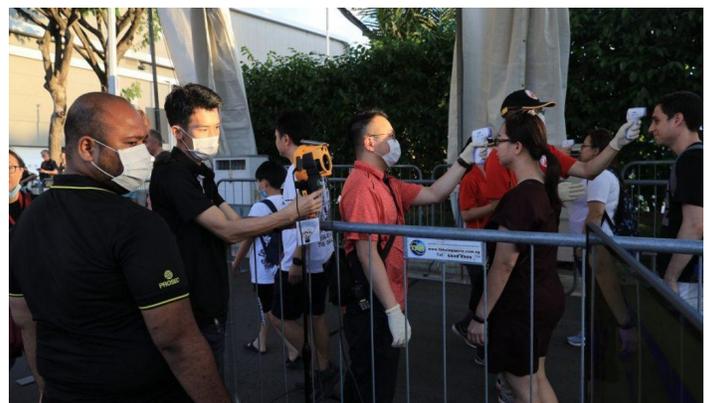
